Ordinance No. 8/12/2021

An ordinance to adopt updates to the Town of Siren Year 2030 Comprehensive Plan

The Town Board of the Town of Siren, Burnett County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to section 60.22(3) and 62.23(2) and (3), Wisconsin Statutes, the Town of Siren is authorized to prepare and adopt updates to a comprehensive plan as defined in sections 66.1001(1)(a) and 66.1001(2), of the Wisconsin Statutes.

SECTION 2. The Town Board of Siren has adopted written procedures designed to foster public participation in every stage of the preparation of updates to the Comprehensive Plan as required by Section 66.1001(4)(a), of the Wisconsin Statutes.

SECTION 3. The Town of Siren Plan Commission, by a majority vote of the entire commission as recorded in its official minutes, has passed a resolution recommending to the Town Board the adoption of the Updated Recommended Text containing all of the elements specified in section 66.1001(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes.

SECTION 4. The Town of Siren has provided the opportunities for public involvement as required in section 66.1001(4), of the Wisconsin Statutes.

SECTION 5. The Town Board of the Town of Siren does, by enactment of this ordinance, formally adopt the document updated recommended text pursuant to section 66.1001(4)(c), of the Wisconsin Statutes.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage by a majority vote of the members-elect of the Town Board and publication/posting as required by law.

ATV - VILLAGE POLICE PATROL

Chief Chris Syberg was present to discuss the ATV Traffic.

The Siren Police officers make sure to set aside time in their shifts to monitor ATV activity between our three full time officers. There is an average of 9-12 hours a month that is used to patrol the Town of Siren for ATV activity to ensure the safety of the residents and to decrease criminal activity.

On May 16th, 2020 - ATV accident on Lonestar Road

August 13th, 2020 - Illegal cutting down of trees on Taylor Lake Road

End on August - incident with individuals driving on the road in a golf cart.

The Officers have stopped and warned multiple motorists at intersections and on the road regarding rules and regulations of the state to make sure to keep the roads safe for everyone. The Village puts in around 200 miles a month around the Siren Township.

Cost \$4,000.00 per year
