

SIREN TOWN BOARD MEETING
DECEMBER 11, 2025

The Town of Siren held their monthly board meeting on December 11, 2025, immediately following the Sanitary District meeting at the Siren Town Hall

Chairman Wayne Wiberg called the meeting to order at 6:45PM.

Open Meeting Notices were verified.

Oath of office was given to incoming Siren Fire Association Chief, Johnathan Doric.

The clerk presented the names of election officials for the 2026-27 election cycle. Motion by Philip Stiemann to approve the list of names. Second by Wayne Wiberg. Motion carried 2-0, Diane Lund abstained.

Treasurers Report: (Attached) Motion by Philip Stiemann to approve Treasurers report. Second by Diane Lund. Motion carried 3-0.

Clerk's Report:

- Motion by Diane Lund to approve November 2025 Board Meeting Minutes. Second by Philip Stiemann. Motion carried 3-0.
- Motion by Philip Stiemann to approve paying the bills. Second by Diane Lund. Motion carried 3-0.

Public Input: None

Land Use:

- Contract for timber sale by Bell Lumber was reviewed. Motion by Diane Lund to approve the contract. Second by Philip Stiemann. Motion carried 3-0.
- Diane gave an update on current land use subjects at the county level. Diane would like to add a review of the driveway ordinance for the January meeting.

Ordinance Review:

- Ordinance 2025-12-11: Exemption from Treasurers Bond. Over half of the municipalities in Burnett County have passed a similar ordinance. The clerk and treasurer are already bonded as required by state statutes. Motion by Wayne Wiberg to adopt Ordinance 2025-12-11. Second by Philip Stiemann. Motion carried 3-0.

Roads & Equipment:

- a. 2025 LRIP Project: Clerk has submitted all required paperwork for reimbursement to Mark Servi. Don't expect payment before February 2026.
- b. Burnikel Bridge: Bridge is done and signed off by inspector.
- c. Road Maintenance:
 - i. Grinding in progress on Imme Rd.
- d. Equipment Update –

- i. New plow truck going into the shop at Monroe in early January. Expect delivery approximately 6 weeks from that date.

Correspondence and Upcoming Meetings:

- Gov. Evers has signed 2025 Act 71 into law – highlights include easing the process for towns to transition from elected treasurer and clerk to appointed. This may be something the Board wants to consider at the next annual meeting. Also in Act 71 is a change to the notice requirements for budget hearings.... more consistent with other notice requirements.
- The district meeting calendar has been published by WTA. Board of Review training will be available during these sessions.
